Drive Through Distribution of COVID Test Kits at Senior Center - Feb 5

Free COVID-19 home test kits will be distributed to those who live within the municipal limits of the City of Bowie on **February 5**. Distribution will begin at 9 a.m. at the Bowie Senior Center (14900 Health Center Drive) and will continue until all supplies for the day are distributed. Each household is eligible to receive one test box (containing 2 test kits) at this event and proof of residency is required. This will be **a drive through event. No walk-ups**. Residents must remain in their vehicles and wear masks while interacting with staff. Visit www.cityofbowie.org/athometests for more information. Instructions on how to conduct the test are provided on the test kit box and can be found at www.ihealthlabs.com.

Please note: The Senior Center will be closed to the public on Saturday.

FAQ

Who is eligible to receive test kits through the City of Bowie?

City residents are eligible to receive tests through this municipal allocation. For this event, one (1) test box, which contains two (2) tests, will be distributed to each City of Bowie address. You will be asked to provide identification that proves that you live in Bowie to receive a test kit.

What will happen at this event?

This is strictly a drive through test distribution event. No walk ups will be permitted. Distribution will begin at 9 a.m. on Saturday, February 5 and will continue that day until 1,100 tests are distributed. Please wear a mask while interacting with City staff.

What is the test brand?

Tests are manufactured by iHealth, which is one of the [manufacturers approved by the Federal Drug Administration](#).

Where do I get instructions on taking test?

iHealth has produced [instructions](#) on how to take the test. More information can be found at www.ihealthlabs.com.

How do I report my results?

Positive COVID-19 test results can be reported to your primary care physician and the [Maryland Department of Health at Maryland Department of Health Positive At-Home Test Self-Reporting](#).

Any questions or concerns about a positive result should be answered by your primary care physician or Prince George's County Health Department at 301-883-6627.

Why so few tests?

Prince George's County received a shipment of tests for municipalities to distribute. The City of Bowie was given an allocation of 2,000, based on our population size. 900 were given out at an event on January 28. The February 5 distribution is on a weekend to accommodate those who could not stop by during the work week.

When will Bowie do this again?

The City has requested an additional 25,000 tests for distribution to city residents. When/if they are received, other distribution events will be announced.

Don't Make it Easy for Criminals

The Bowie Police Department is again seeing more thefts from autos. Please make sure that you are not making your car an easy target for criminals.

- Stay with your car while it warms up.
- Remove valuables from the car.
- Make sure you have your keys or key fob when you get out of your car.
- Lock it and then pull the handle to double check that it is really locked.
(Remember -- if you leave a key fob in the car, it won't lock AND if your key fob is inside but still close to your vehicle, it may prevent the lock from engaging.)

Single-Family Housing Grants for Low & Moderate Income Residents

The Single-Family Housing Rehabilitation Program is a federally funded grant program that provides City of Bowie single family homeowners with grants up to \$10,000 for energy efficiency related home upgrades and repairs to correct hazardous conditions, eliminate safety hazards, repair or replace major systems, correction of interior and exterior deficiencies, energy improvements, modifications for persons with disabilities and the removal of lead paint hazards. To be eligible to participate, the applicant must be of low to moderate income and be the legal owner and full-time resident of a property located within the incorporated boundaries of the City of Bowie. Applicants must provide income and asset verification. Additional federal requirements apply.

Apply Now for the “Bowie First” Mortgage Assistance Program

The City of Bowie, in cooperation with the State of Maryland, is launching the “Bowie First” Mortgage Assistance Program on February 15, 2022.

This program will provide grants to assist Bowie employees, teachers, police officers, and persons with disabilities purchase a home in the City. The grant is in the form of closing cost assistance for the purchase. Grants are for \$2,000 and will be matched by the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development’s Maryland Mortgage Program, providing a total of \$4,000 for each applicant. Applicants may not get cash back at settlement. The “Bowie First” Mortgage Assistance Program fund may be combined with other standard down-payment/closing cost grants, and with grants offered by the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development, Community Development Administration.

Updated Mask Guidance

The rapid spread of the omicron variant has refocused attention on the importance of masking as a critical health tool in preventing the spread of COVID-19.

On January 14, the CDC updated its [mask guidance](#) to provide more specific information about different types of masks and how to wear them. The CDC says that respirators, such as N95 and KN95, offer “the highest level of protection”. The CDC also clarified that it is now acceptable for individuals to use respirators regularly, since there are few concerns about supply shortages. Wearing a highly protective mask or respirator may be most important for certain higher risk situations, or by some people at [increased risk for severe disease](#). Learn more: [Improve How Your Mask Protects You](#)

The bottom line is that when transmission is substantial or high, wearing a mask protects you, your family and your community from getting or passing on COVID-19.

Best practices for masks:

- Wear a mask with the best fit, protection and comfort for you.
- Choose a mask that has two or more layers of washable, breathable fabric.
- The mask should completely cover your nose, mouth and chin.
- A well-fitting mask fits snugly against the sides of your face and doesn’t have gaps.

COVID Testing

Testing continues to be an important component in the strategy to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Below is a summary of current testing options:

At-home testing

- Request a test kit through the federal government - [COVID Home Tests | USPS](#)
- Pick up a test kit at one of the local distribution points at certain libraries and community centers. [See this week's list.](#)
- Purchase a test with the help of your health insurance company. As of January 15, 2022, private insurance companies are required to cover at-home COVID-19 tests. Insurance companies and health plans are required to cover eight free at-home tests per covered individual per month. Contact your provider for details.

American Red Cross Declares Blood Crisis

The American Red Cross has declared the first-ever Blood Crisis amid the Omicron surge. The agency stated that it is facing a national blood crisis, its worst blood shortage in over a decade, posing a concerning risk to patient care. Amid this crisis, doctors have been forced to make difficult decisions about who receives blood transfusions and who will need to wait until more products become available.

Vaccinations

State officials continue to urge all eligible Marylanders to get vaccinated for COVID and the flu and get their booster shots just as soon as they are eligible.

To find a clinic, visit covidvax.maryland.gov or call the state's multilingual call center, available seven days a week, at 1-855-MD-GOVAX (1-855-634-6829).

COVID-19 vaccination operations have returned to the Wayne K. Curry Sports and Learning Complex. Appointments are preferred, but limited walk-in-hours are available. Vaccinations are also available at pharmacies throughout the area, usually by appointment.

County Residents May Pick Up Free KN95 Masks at Multiple Locations

Free CDC-approved adult-sized KN95 masks are available for Prince George's County residents at multiple locations, while supplies last. The State-supplied masks are available at County COVID-19 testing sites and vaccination clinics during regular operating hours, as well as at select Prince George's County Memorial Library System (PGCMLS) branches and Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) community centers during weekly rapid test kit distributions.

Each County resident present at a mask distribution site will receive two masks. Residents must provide proof of residency; examples include but are not limited to, a driver's license, utility bill, or lease agreement. The masks are free regardless of insurance or immigration status.

"We strongly encourage residents to wear higher-filtration masks like KN95s over their noses and mouths to give themselves and those around them the best mask protection from COVID-19," said

Prince George’s County Deputy Chief Administrative Officer for Health, Human Services, and Education Dr. George L. Askew. “Cases in the County are declining, but transmission remains high. Omicron continues to be the dominant variant and it is highly contagious. Correct and consistent masking remains critical to slowing the spread and keeping each other healthy.”

Free KN95 masks are also available, while supplies last, at three Maryland Department of Health COVID-19 testing sites in the County. In addition, Prince George’s County Public Schools continue to hand out free KN95 masks each week to students and staff.

FDA Issues Recall for CovClear and ImmunoPass Rapid Test

The FDA issued a warning to the public to stop using Empowered Diagnostics COVID-19 tests. Empowered Diagnostics is recalling the CovClear COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test and the ImmunoPass COVID-19 Neutralizing Antibody Rapid Test. These tests were distributed with labeling indicating they are authorized by the FDA, but neither test has been authorized, cleared, or approved by the FDA for

distribution or use in the U.S. The FDA is concerned about the potentially higher risk of false results when using unauthorized tests, and has identified this as a class I recall, the most serious type of recall.

Consumer Alert – Beware Of Covid Door-To-Door Testing

The Maryland Office of the Attorney General is alerting Marylanders of individuals and labs offering door-to-door COVID testing. The individuals performing these tests promise prompt results, but consumers have reported not receiving results several weeks after the initial test. Consumers have complained that they do not know how their personal identifying information is being secured.
