Budget Process

City Council is almost finished reviewing the Proposed FY23 Budget and Capital Improvements Program. The budget will take effect July 1, 2022. The remaining budget meetings take place on:

- Monday, May 9, 8 p.m. Budget Worksession #5 Department of Planning & Community Development, Information Technology, Equipment Acquisition and Replacement Fund, General Fund Summaries, Appendix (including Plan of Compensation), Wrap-up.
- Monday, May 16, 8 p.m. Adoption FY 2023 Budget and Capital Improvements Program.

Update on our Career Training Program

Bowie's new job training program launched in April. This free program provides city residents with an opportunity to learn new job skills, change careers, or make themselves more marketable through a special partnership with our online training partner, Coursera.

Over 100 Bowie residents have already signed up to take advantage of our FREE online job skills training program. Slots are limited, so be sure to apply now; the only requirement is that you must be a City of Bowie resident.

This program includes two course tracks. There are still some openings in the general worktraining track, and several slots are still open in the "Grow with Google" professional certificate track. Classes in the Google Career Certificate track are available in fields such as data analytics, IT support, project management, user experience (UX) design, and just recently, e-commerce and digital marketing were added as options. Bowie Water Filter Rebate Program

Bowie Water System customers who are experiencing discolored water due to sedimentation may be eligible for a City rebate of up to \$1,800 to help defray the costs of purchasing and installing a whole house water filtration system or water filter(s) at their property. SHA Presents New Plans for Improving MD 197 Between Kenhill & MD 450

On Tuesday evening, the Maryland State Highway Administration held a virtual public meeting to present design ideas for the improvement of MD 197, between Kenhill Drive and MD 450.

Proposed improvements include widening MD 197 from two lanes to four lanes, realigning and enhancing the existing bike lane along northbound MD 197, introducing noise reduction measures along both sides of that segment of roadway, and relocating aerial utilities underground. This project has been talked about for several years but had been mostly dormant since 2015. Since resuming

work on the project in January 2022, the Maryland State Highway Administration has redeveloped the design concept to be less expansive and to lower vehicle speeds. The new proposal includes three traffic roundabouts at the intersection of Lerner Lane/Foxhill Park, Faith Lane/Lyle Lane and Long Ridge Lane/Tulip Grove Drive.

SHA intends to complete the current effort and present the 30% design plans at a public meeting later this year. Please visit the <u>SHA project website</u> to learn more about the project and to view the full list of questions and answers that were addressed at the April 26 virtual meeting.

COVID CORNER



Prince George's County remains at a low <u>COVID-19 community transmission level</u> according to the CDC. Arlington County, the City of Alexandria, and some counties in central Virginia have moved back to a medium rate of transmission recently, as have some areas of New England.

The Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security added a COVID-19 Testing Toolkit with Frequently Asked Questions. Questions and answers are regularly updated to reflect new information, federal guidance, and topics of interest.

CDC Recommendation on Masking

At this time, the CDC recommends that everyone aged 2 and older, including passengers and workers, properly wear a well-fitting mask or respirator over the nose and mouth in indoor areas of public transportation (such as airplanes, trains, etc.) and transportation hubs (such as airports, stations, etc.). The CDC also encourages operators of public transportation and transportation hubs to support mask wearing by all people, including employees.

According to the CDC, this public health recommendation is based on the currently available data, circulating variants and their impact on disease severity and vaccine effectiveness, current trends in COVID-19 community levels within the U.S., and projections of COVID-19 trends in the coming months.

FDA Warning About Counterfeit COVID Test Kits

The FDA issued a warning informing the public that there are **counterfeit versions** of the following athome over the counter COVID-19 diagnostic tests being distributed or used in the US:

- Flowflex COVID-19 Test Kits
- iHealth COVID-19 Antigen Rapid Test Kits
