LOCATION: Excalibur Road at Mitchellville Road, Bowie, MD 20716

LOCATION TYPE: Street

DATE & TIME OF INCIDENT: May 11, 2013 / 0459 Hours

SYNOPSIS OF INCIDENT:

On May 11, 2013 at 0459 hours while on routine patrol in the area of Harbor Way and Mitchellville Road, PFC Gonzalez observed a green Buick LeSabre bearing a Maryland registration plate driving on the wrong side of the road. PFC Gonzalez proceeded to get behind the vehicle which was driving at a high rate of speed. The vehicle then drove through a steady red circular traffic signal at Mitchellville Road and Harbor Way. PFC Gonzalez then attempted to conduct a traffic stop on the vehicle which failed to stop and ran another steady red circular traffic signal at Mitchellville Road and Collington Road, while still traveling at a high rate of speed. PFC Gonzalez then lost sight of the vehicle after it appeared to be making a left onto Excalibur Road from Mitchellville Road. When PFC Gonzalez arrived at the intersection, he observed that the vehicle had lost control and left the roadway, striking a traffic signal pole and causing severe damage to the vehicle. He also observed a black male with no shirt and a black backpack fleeing the scene toward Excalibur Court. There were also two other individuals still with the vehicle. The remaining individuals were detained and eventually transported to Prince George's Hospital with injuries sustained from the accident. An area canvas was initiated to locate the fleeing suspect. A search of the vehicle revealed numerous pieces of what were believed to be stolen property. At this point a citizen placed a call for service for a black male with no shirt running to the rear of 3702 Excalibur Court. The area was searched but the suspect was not able to be located. However, a black backpack was recovered from the wood line to the rear of 3702 Excalibur Court. A large plastic bag containing 116 grams of suspected marijuana and a black .38 Rossi revolver loaded with one round were discovered inside the backpack.

Later that morning, Sgt. Bell and Cpl. Schwartz located a black male with blood on his face at Wal-Mart located at 3300 Crain Highway. This was believed to be the fleeing suspect from the accident. He was identified as Trevin Drew Coleman and transported to the Bowie Police station where he was questioned by Det. Wuthrich. Coleman then gave a recorded oral and written statement confessing to being the driver of the vehicle and the owner of the black backpack. Continued investigation revealed that the vehicle and property found inside were taken during a breaking and entering of a home in University Park. It was also discovered that Coleman had an open warrant through Cheverly PD which had not yet been entered into the system. PGPD District One Evidence Technician Copely (2270) took possession of the stolen merchandise recovered from the vehicle and the investigations into the breaking and entering are being conducted by PGPD Det. Clark (3222). Coleman is currently being held without bond in Upper Marlboro for the incident in Cheverly. PFC Gonzalez has since applied for a Statement of

Charges with the District Court Commissioner for the handgun and CDS recovered from Coleman's backpack.
