Lieutenant Robert Stevenson is a third generation and 19-year veteran of law enforcement; having started his career in 2003 with the Metropolitan Police Department in Washington, D.C. He joined the City of Bowie Police Department in December 2007 and was promoted to the rank of Sergeant eight months later. Having served as the department's first Training Coordinator, he gained valuable knowledge and experience in developing relationships with various vendors and subject-matter experts to create, revise and enhance the training curriculums for sworn officers.

Lt. Stevenson is exceptionally proud of the opportunity he had to spearhead and implement the City of Bowie Police Department Naloxone Response Program to combat opioid overdoses; becoming the first police agency in Prince George's County to do so.

Lt. Stevenson has attended several career development training seminars, which have assisted in his transition to various positions and roles. He attended Montgomery College in Rockville, Maryland and was also a student at the Johns Hopkins University Public Safety Leadership curriculum in Organizational Development. His desire to enhance the work environment and create opportunities within it can be seen in such endeavors as founding the Bowie Police Department Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 140. In 2023, Lt. Stevenson oversaw the project that opened the Community Information Center at Bowie Town Center in April of 2023.

Lt. Stevenson has been assigned as a supervisor in the Patrol Division, Special Assignment Team, Criminal Investigations Section, and is currently the Commander of the Investigative Services Division, which is comprised of Community Services, Criminal Investigations, and Traffic Safety Unit.
