What is the Senior Citizen "Green" Housing Rehabilitation Program?

The Senior Citizen "Green" Housing Rehabilitation Program is a federally funded grant program that provides financial assistance to single family—senior citizen homeowners with limited financial means. The purpose of the grant is to provide energy efficiency related upgrades and repairs to correct hazardous conditions, eliminate safety hazards, repair or replace major



systems,
correct interior and exterior deficiencies, energy
improvements, modifications for
persons with

disabilities and eliminate lead based paint hazards.



Income Eligibility

To be eligible to participate, applicants must have a total annual household income limit that does not exceed 80% of the Washington MSA income guidelines, adjusted for family size.

Eligibility Criteria

- 1. Must be 62 years of age or older
- 2. Legal owner and full time resident of property located within City limits.

Terms and Conditions

- The maximum grant fund per household is \$10,000. Prior grant recipients are ineligible to apply.
- Grant recipient shall agree to repay grant funds if the property is sold or transferred within five years of approval.
- Applicant must provide income and asset verification.
- 4. Additional federal requirements apply.
