

BOWIE HERITAGE TRAIL FALLING WATERS COURT TO JERICHO PARK

Background	The Trail is an extension of the Bowie Heritage Trail in Huntington (Old Bowie) and is to be constructed in five segments. The third segment, a ten foot wide 2,250 foot long trail is proposed to be constructed from Falling Waters Court (within Adnell Woods) to its terminus within the Park
Project Scope	<p>Construction of a 2,250 foot, 10 foot wide multimodal bituminous trail. The serpentine design was utilized to take advantage of the existing trail networks and topography thus avoiding large scaled tree clearing and earth moving operations. Barrier devices are being installed to deter all wheeled motorized vehicles from using the trails but are not to restrictive to prevent mobility challenged users from enjoying the trails. The plans also add fences along the adjoining residential lots to deter trail users from trespassing on private properties.</p> <p>ADA compliant parking is only available at the Trailhead, which is located within the Park. Trailhead parking is not proposed on falling Waters Court to avoid excessive vehicle traffic within the established neighborhood.</p>

Brief Overview: The multimodal trail will connect Huntington City to the 70 acre Jericho Park recreational area.

Trail Length: +/-, 250 linear feet.

Trail Width: 10 feet

Trail Construction: Bituminous asphalt

Visual Impacts: The woodland trail is a low impact construction project. The horizontal and vertical alignments were determined by extensive site visits by City staff. Staff chose an alignment to avoid large trees (and their respective root zones), to limit medium tree and underbrush clearing and to reduced earth work.
